

The Deacon's Corner

On Saturday, January 28, 2023, after less than three and a half hours of convention time, we elected our next Bishop, the Reverend Canon Dr. Sally French. Many gathered in our beautiful Cathedral. Still others of us joined the great throng, as the hymn says, via the use of technology.

Either way, the excitement that comes with anticipation, then completion—of this step, at any rate—was intense and palpable. It lingered even after the closing hymn and dismissal. It could be seen in the posts, welcomes, and well-wishes going directly up on social media. The Diocesan website displayed the news immediately. A new era was coming in. We'd had time to process the idea of having to make our goodbyes to our Bishop of the last ten years, and to go forward into the unknown; today was a day to celebrate having reached a decision and preparing for the time ahead.

These new beginnings—they are so significant to us. As a liturgical Church, we put an emphasis on rites of passage, a focus on where God is present in beginnings, turning points, and endings. Sometimes when we're in the middle, in between those things, we forget that—forget that God is there through all aspects of those times.

We are reminded during baptisms, confirmations, and other sacraments; we are reminded when we re-create the turning points in the life of Jesus Christ during those climactic moments in the church calendar; we are reminded when we call a new shepherd to our flock.

The intensity of such occasions isn't with us all of the time (that would truly be a bit much) $\|_{V}$ but our prayer life can offer opportunities to remind ourselves of the renewals in our lives, of

God's constant invitations to us to do so. Those invitations show up all over Scripture and all through our prayerbooks; they are there in that quiet sense that we get in our solitary prayer time and in those moments when we feel God moving through interaction with those in our lives. By the time you read this, the excitement of this particular day will have faded. But the constant action of our God, the reawakenings and renewals that come with that—that remains ongoing. 




The stained-glass windows of Christ Church

The beautiful stained-glass windows in Christ Church are primarily a ministry of color which helps to transform our Church building into a house of worship. But they are more than just mere decorations. In keeping with the name of the parish, they portray the highlights of Christ's earthly life. А number of the windows are new since the explosion of 1950 that destroyed several of our original windows. Stained glass is a hand craft practiced in America today in virtually the same manner as it was in Europe in the Middle Ages. Each window has an associated Bible text that can be used for meditation and reflection. The following key shows the location of each of these beautiful windows.

(1) <u>The Annunciation</u>

In memory of Edwin Williams and his daughter Emma Agnes. Given by Mrs. Edwin Williams.

St. Luke 1:28-39. ²⁸ And having come in, the angel said to her, "Rejoice, highly favored one, the Lord is with you; blessed are you among women!" ²⁹ But when she saw him, she was troubled at his saying, and considered what manner of greeting this was. ³⁰ Then the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. ³¹ And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bring forth a Son, and shall call His name Jesus. ³² He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Highest; and the Lord God will give Him the throne of His father David. ³³ And He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of His kingdom there will be no end." ³⁴ Then Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I do not know a man?" ³⁵ And the angel answered and said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Highest will overshadow you; therefore, also, that Holy One who is to be born will be called the Son of God. ³⁶ Now indeed, Elizabeth your relative has also conceived a son in her old age; and this is now the sixth month for her who was called barren. ³⁷ For with God nothing will be impossible." ³⁸ Then Mary said, "Behold the maidservant of the Lord! Let it be to me according to your word." And the angel departed from her. ³⁹ Now Mary arose in those days and went into the hill country with haste, to a city of Judah.
